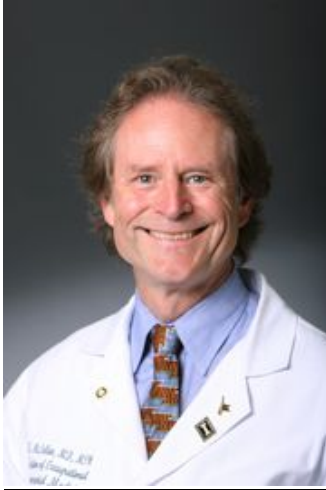

Robert K. McLellan, MD, MPH, FACOEM, FAAFP is the Chief of the Section of Occupational and Environmental Medicine of Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center, and is Professor of Medicine, Community and Family Medicine, and The Dartmouth Institute at Geisel School of Medicine. He is a past president of the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine, as well as the New England College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine.

Dr. McLellan has extensive experience as an occupational and environmental medical consultant in a wide range of economic sectors and across the nation. He has maintained a clinical practice in occupational and environmental medicine for over 30 years. He routinely evaluates and treats patients with toxic exposures at work and in the community. His work has included funding provided by the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry to educate physicians and community citizens in New Hampshire about hazardous waste and environmental contamination. This work consisted of staffing a hotline for physician questions about chemical exposures, presenting at multiple physician conferences and community meetings throughout the state, and authoring a newspaper column about environmental exposures. While practicing in Connecticut he also ran a consulting business which investigated residential and commercial environmental contamination.

He is the recipient of numerous awards including: the New Hampshire Public Health Association's Roger Fossum award "for dedicated commitment and leadership in environmental and public health", the President's Award from The American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine for work in Environmental Medicine and the Harriet Hardy Award from the New England College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine "for a physician who exemplifies the highest ideals of occupational and environmental medicine practice."
